The [New Mexico Health Equity Partnership](#) (HEP), an initiative at the Santa Fe Community Foundation works with a network of partners and allies to build movement to ensure every New Mexican can lead a healthy life, live in neighborhoods where our children and families thrive, and have a say in the decisions that impact their communities and their lives. We do this by:

- Offering funding and coaching to support community-based research;
- Creating critical connections and linkages via gatherings and our communications platforms;
- Providing resources to increase organizational and advocacy capacity; and
- Fostering authentic community engagement.

ABOUT THE BOYS AND MEN OF COLOR RESOURCE POOL

HEP is excited to announce that we are a recipient of the 2017 RISE for Boys and Men of Color Capacity Building Award. RISE for Boys and Men of Color is a field advancement effort that aims to better understand and strategically improve the lives, experiences and outcomes of boys and men of color in the United States. RISE spans five fields (education, health, human services and social policy, juvenile and criminal justice, and workforce development) and focuses on four populations (Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders, Blacks, Latinos, and Native Americans).

As a recipient of this award, in 2018 HEP will distribute a “capacity building resource” pool up to \$40,000 to grassroots organizations in Albuquerque and in surrounding indigenous communities between March 1, 2018 and October 31, 2018. Five to eight small grants will be awarded between the amounts of \$4,000 - \$7,500. Proposed ideas may include an organization hiring a consultant to help improve the organization’s current data collection systems; an organization’s members participating in a series of workshops to strengthen their skills; or collaborative partners convening together to develop practices to strengthen boys and men of color data sharing. These resources will be used to sustain and strengthen the work of boys and men of color by enhancing the ability of organizations to assess, document, and track effective practices and forward-thinking, asset-based, unconventional solutions. The vision is to advance understanding about the relationship between

opportunities, social conditions, and systems that impact boys and men of color, and provide specificity in meeting the needs of certain communities.

WHAT WILL HEP PROVIDE?

- Between \$4,000 - \$7,500 for capacity building activities.
- Capacity-building grantee partners will be invited to join the HEP network and submit and share success stories and lessons learned via the HEP newsletter.
- HEP hosts an online forum on our website which grantees can utilize for peer discussion groups and sharing of best and promising practices. We also have Zoom which grantee partners may use for virtual dialogues.
- As network members, capacity-building grantees will be invited to engage in networking and peer learning with other grantee partners and network members at the HEP Statewide Gathering in October 2018.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Grassroots organizations that are working to improve the lives, experiences, and outcomes of boys and men of color (Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders, Blacks, Latinos, and Native Americans).
- Grassroots organizations whose work is in Albuquerque or surrounding Native American communities within New Mexico.
- Grassroots organizations that are considered tax-exempt as described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, are in the process of applying for 501(c)(3) status, or that can demonstrate a connection with at least one organization that has 501(c)(3) status and will serve as a fiscal sponsor.
- Grassroots organizations receiving RISE Boys and Men of Color capacity building funding through another grant are not eligible for this opportunity.

SUBMISSION PROCESS

Applications will be accepted until **February 16, 2018 at 11:59 pm**. Submit your application by email to Jessi Jensen (jjensen@nmhep.org). We encourage applicants to contact us about their proposed capacity building ideas prior to applying so we can provide guidance and feedback.

SELECTION CRITERIA

HEP staff and steering committee will assess all applications.

Selection will be based on the following:

- At a minimum, eligibility requirements must be met.
- Organizations should center the leadership, ideas, and expertise of boys and men of color in their capacity building efforts.
- Applications must demonstrate alignment with the fields of focus (education, health, human services and social policy, Juvenile and Criminal Justice, workforce development).
- Applications must demonstrate alignment with one or more of the nine principles:
 - Narrative Change
 - Primary, Gender-Specific Focus on Boys and Men of Color
 - Balanced Treatment of Racial and Ethnic Groups
 - Interdisciplinarity
 - Intersectionality
 - Disaggregated Data Analysis
 - Networks and Collective Action
 - Culturally Relevant, Authentic, Inclusive and Rigorous Evaluation
 - Multiple Ways of Knowing
 - Structural, Systemic, and Policy Change
- Applications must demonstrate alignment with one or more of the capacity building areas.
 - Upgrading existing data collection systems/infrastructure
 - Development/Implementation of evaluation plans
 - Strengthening data integration/sharing among Boys and Men of Color collaborative partners
- Applications must demonstrate potential to build or enhance specific capacities, skills, and or leadership to advance the field of Boys and Men of Color in New Mexico.
